National News

Around one in 25 young people in the UK identify as lesbian, gay or bisexual, new figures suggest. The Office for National Statistics said 4.1% of 16 to 24-year-olds identified as LGB, up from 3.3% in 2015: [A "statistically significant increase".](#)

Absence of young people rattles Conservatives. Party obsesses over youth vote as **average age** of members rises to **72**. Speakers at fringe events dwelt on the contrast between the near absence of young people at the conference and the tens of thousands of enthusiastic Labour supporters at the opposition party's conference last week in Brighton: [An endangered species: Young Conservatives](#)

Tories will make young people better off, chancellor promises. Philip Hammond opened the Conservative conference with policies aimed at wooing younger voters, but his promises were described as 'mediocre': ["The Labour party will simply outbid us. No question about that"](#)

Almost half of all young people in England go on to higher education. Government's measure of higher education participation reaches 49%, highest level since introduction of £9,000 fees, almost reaching Tony Blair's 1999 pledge: [A 10,000 rise in the number of those going to university for the first time](#)

Brexit is as toxic to young people as Trump's wall, minister warns Theresa May. Phillip Lee also tells the Prime Minister she lacks a 'mandate' for her original vision of hard Brexit - after losing her Commons majority: ["The country's social contract is "fraying" and no longer "works for them"](#)

A fifth of young people are homeless - you just can't see them. People sleeping rough are vastly outnumbered by those whose homelessness we don't see. More needs to be done to reach the most vulnerable: [One in five young people in the UK have sofa-surfed in the past year](#)

Tory MP sparks anger saying jobless young people should take up farm work alongside 'gorgeous EU women'. Craig Mackinlay said British youngsters needed to match the motivation of European workers: ["What's not to like? Get on your bike and find a job" says Mackinlay](#)

Sale of acids to under-18s to be banned, Amber Rudd says. Her pledge comes as more than 400 attacks using corrosive substances were recorded in the six months to April. She also said she would "drastically limit" sales of sulphuric acid, given that it can be used to make explosives: ["Victims never fully recover"](#)

Young people 'more anxious than ever' due to Brexit and rising debt. Quarter of young people admit to bullying someone online. Over a quarter of young people say they have bullied or insulted someone else online, according to a recent study. Research from *Demos* found that boys are significantly more likely to have bullied someone online than girls: [15 per cent said they had "joined in with other people to "troll" a celebrity"](#)

Genes may predict how well the flu vaccine will work in young people. Nine genes are like a crystal ball for young people, but not adults: [It's all in the genes](#)

Childhood bullying anxiety declines over time, study says. Anxiety and depression caused by childhood bullying decreases over time, showing that children are able to recover, a study suggests: [Psychiatrists said bullying could have serious effects on young people's mental health for a long time](#)
