Introduction

Established in 2003, The Children, Young People and Families Consortium is a group of around 30 Voluntary Community Sector (VCS) organisations who work together and with partners to develop and raise standards, influence the Children and Young Peoples' agenda in Rotherham and provide the best possible VCS contribution to improving outcomes for children, young people and families.

We host the **Voice and Influence Partnership**, a sub-group of the CYP&F Consortium which brings statutory and VCS services together to ensure that the voice and lived experience of children, young people and families are able to have meaningful impact on decisions that affect them whilst providing a point of contact for those who want to involve young people in service planning, decision making and policy development.

We also support the **Different But Equal Board**, a network of young people aged 11-18 (up to 25 with SEND) who come together to ensure that when plans or decisions affect children and young people they are involved at the outset and throughout in shaping these by utilising its member's unique talents and working alongside other young people and practitioners in order for this vision to become a reality.

Strategic Aims

1. Service Delivery & Commissioning

To work with partners to innovate and change how services are commissioned and delivered continue meeting the needs of children, young people and families amidst a challenging environment and reduced resources

2. Collaborative Consortia Approach To ensure a collaborative consortia approach to pro-actively plan ways to maximise funding and other opportunities to anticipate and meet the needs of children, young people and families

3. Safeguarding Standards

To promote excellent safeguarding standards amongst our voluntary sector members and share our learning to influence the wider sector to keep children and young people safe

4. Voice & Influence

To ensure our service users (children, young people and families) and our member organisations have a voice to influence policy and change things for the better.

5. Best Practice & Workforce Development

To build on the collective voice and experience of members to improve outcomes for children young people and families through sharing skills, knowledge and evidence-based practice and workforce development

6. Resilience & Cohesion

To work collaboratively to promote resilience and cohesion within and between all communities in Rotherham

Consortium Strategic Coordinator

The Consortium Strategic Co-ordinator brings together all of the above elements of the Consortium and works to enable partnership working and maximise impact in areas such as;

- Acting as a single point of access to VCS organisations working with children, young people and
 families in order to share information and shape practice such as shared implementation of;
 Signs of Safety ways of working, use of the Safeguarding Online Self-assessment to ensure
 consistency and a level of assurance (which through the consortium's input is now being used
 across Children and Adult services) and the dissemination of safeguarding policy and practice.
- Strategic representation by the Consortium enables the VCS to be collectively "at the table and a two-way flow of information between the VCS and the local authority in order to understand the needs and demands of the borough and its communities, join the dots, make necessary connections and inform strategy and planning.
- Collaborative working such as the response to the Department of Education Holiday provision fund with Early Help and the submission of the Smiles for Miles Base project in partnership with the local authority enables cross sector partnership working for a whole system approach.
- Delivering new and preventative services by pooling information from the VCS, local authority and other partners, collating local and national research and linking this to funding opportunities which support work to benefit children and young people across the borough. Examples of some of these are; £262000 from the Ministry of Justice to respond to Child Sexual Exploitation, £50000 from the National Lottery heritage fund to improve cultural access and respond to findings from the RMBC Young Inspectors, £99,806 from the National Lottery Community Fund to extend services during Covid-19 and £484000 at final application stage for a borough-wide collaborative consortia approach project in partnership with the local authority.
- The Voice and Influence Partnership (chaired and co-ordinated by the Strategic Co-ordinator role) as a central mechanism involves children and young people of different identities meaningfully and appropriately in planning and decision making which affects them. This has resulted in children and young people being involved in public realm decisions, commissioning activities and recruitment processes.
- The Different But Equal Board supported by the Consortium Strategic Coordinator and Consortium member organisations is not just a group of young people, but a body for change that seeks to improve voice opportunities for future young people and offers an alternative perspective to voice initiatives. As young people representatives of member organisations, it provides links to groups of young people from a wider network.
- Responding to requests for consultation, information and research such as the snapshot of youth loneliness requested by Public Health, the development of a resource around EHCP's and the Moving On project in connection with the Rotherham CCG.
